Conformity declaration – RoHS

We hereby confirm that our products conform to RoHS Directive 2011/65/EU of 08/06/2011 of the European Parliament and of the Council on the restriction of the use of hazardous substances in electric and electronic components and equipment as well as adherence to maximum allowable concentration in homogeneous substances in percent by weight <0.01 % of cadmium, <0.1 % of lead, mercury, hexavalent chromium (Cr6+), polybrominated biphenyl (PBB) and polybrominated diphenyl ethers (PBDE) in accordance with Annex II of the Directive.

Hans Eberle AG hereby declares that all our products are produced in compliance with RoHS.

Adjustment of the RoHS Directive 2015/863: 01/04/2016

Extension of the limitation of 4 additional substances

On 4 June 2015, the Commission (EU) adopted and published the inclusion of 4 additional substances in the RoHS Directive 2015/863. These substances are indicated as follows:

- Bis(2-ethylhexyl) phthalate (DEHP) (0,1%)
- Butyl benzyl phthalate (BBP) (0,1%)
- Dibutyl phthalate (DBP) (0,1%)
- Diisobutyl phthalate (DIBP) (0,1%)

The current publication calls on the Member States to put the new regulation into force by 22 July 2019.

Hans Eberle AG is aware of the adjustment and the relevant validity dates. For this reason, we are already working on examining how far we are concerned with this adaptation to ensure concordance with the new Directive 2015/863 by 22 July 2019.

Conformity declaration – REACH

As a manufacturer of sheet metal parts Hans Eberle AG is a “downstream user” for the purpose of the REACH Regulation 1907/2006. Obligations relating to the manufacture and the placing on the market of substances / chemicals for registration (ECHA) do not apply to us.

The goods that we deliver are “products” for the purpose of REACH and are therefore not defined as substances / preparations. Moreover, no substances are released by our products under normal and foreseeable conditions of use. Thus, Hans Eberle AG is not subject to compulsory registration and is not obligated to create safety data sheets.

In order to guarantee our customers a continual supply of reliable and safe products, we ensure that our suppliers comply with all requirements in relation to chemical substances and materials, and that no substances which appear on the list of substances of very high concern (SVHC) are used in the manufacture of our products.
